What are Family Assistance Centers?

Family Assistance Centers (FAC) are considered "one stop shopping" for Military Families. Family Assistance Centers are offices that have been established in order to provide support to Service Members, Veterans, and their Families. They are intended to simplify the process of accessing a variety of services and support.

The primary mission of a FAC is to provide resources, information, and referral, for you and your Family.

Eligibility

Eligibility to receive assistance through a FAC is simple - All Service Members, Veterans and their Families are eligible to use the services provided through the New Hampshire FACs. With five locations throughout the state, we can serve you better, and closer to home! No one, regardless of branch affiliation, will be turned away from a FAC. The purpose of the FAC is to assist, and make every effort to meet the Service Member and Family needs.
