26 Chairperson Fournier moved the next item on the agenda, the White Plains Road culvert Plans.

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Chairperson Fournier asked if Ex-Officio Member Herrick would go over what she had heard regarding
the culvert plans from the last Select Board meeting. Member Herrick then went over the basics of what
Chad Poland from Michie Corp. had explained at the Select Board meeting on the June 6, 2022. She then
explained that due to the time that it would take for NHDES to approve the permit the project would not

be able to be started until next spring. Chairperson Fournier asked how long it would take the replace the culvert once construction started. Member Herrick stated it would take about approximately three weeks

- to complete.
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36 Chairperson Fournier moved to the next item on the agenda, driveway regulations/enforcement.

3738 Member King stated he had a few driveway issues he wanted to discuss with the Board. The first

driveway he wanted to discuss was on Pleasant Street. He stated that a few years ago they had done an

40 enforcement action against the owner because he had put in a driveway without the adequate frontage.

The Town had received a driveway application and was 15 awaiting State approval.
