It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$418.22 for Class V road construction.

It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$600 for the town poor.

It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400 for old age assistance.

It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 for the town library.

It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$85 for Old Home Day.

It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$35 for Memorial Day.

It was voted to pass over article 8 of the warrant.

It was voted to raise a sum equal to one onehundredth of one per cent of the total assessed valuation
of the town based upon the assessment for the year 1940,
for the purpose of advertising the attractions and resources
of the town in connection with other towns in the DartmouthLake Sunapee region.

It was voted to lay article 10 upon the table.

It was voted to discontinue, subject to gates and bars, that portion of a certain town highway between a point easterly of The Glendon on the Warner-Webster town line and the site of the old Amesbury Bridge over the Warner River.

It was voted to lay article 12 on the table.

It was voted to adopt the following resolution:

RESOLVED that the Board of Selectmen be and they hereby are authorized to borrow for the town by the issue of notes a sum not exceeding eight thousand dollars in anticipation of taxes for the year 1941, said notes to be expressly payable from said taxes within one year from the date of their issuance, and further resolved that the Board of Selectmen be and they hereby are authorized to determine the rate of interest on such notes and to provide for the sale thereof.

It was voted to lay articles 14, 15, and 16 on the table and to take up article 24.

It was voted to adopt the following resolution:

RESOLVED that the Board of Selectmen be and they hereby are authorized to sell and convey to the United States of America by good and sufficient deed full title to the existing town hall and the land upon which it stands and to any other real estate owned by the town, excluding highways, within the flowage area of the Blackwater River flood control dam, upon such terms and conditions as the Board of Selectmen may approve.

It was voted that, without limiting the discretion of the Board of Selectmen, the sense of the meeting was that the Board of Selectmen should accept the sum of \$10,000 from the United States of America for the Town Hall and the land upon which it stands.

It was voted to take up article 14.

It was voted that the new location for a town hall be determined by ballot vote and that those desiring the location to be at Corser Hill write "Corser Hill" on their ballots and those desiring the location to be at Sweatt's Mills write "Sweatt's Mills" on their ballots.

The whole number of tickets given in was 104, upon which: Corser Hill had 52 votes and Sweatt's Mills had 52 votes. Upon a second balloting the whole number of tickets given in was 106, upon which:

Corser Hill had 54 votes and Sweatt's Mills had 52 votes; and the moderator declared Corser Hill to be chosen as the new location for a town hall.

It was voted to authorize and empower the Board of Selectmen to acquire by purchase or otherwise all land necessary and desirable for a town hall at Corser Hill upon such terms and conditions as they deem expedient. The vote by ballot was as follows: Yes, 57; no, 19.

It was moved and seconded that the town build a new town hall building and that said building include facilities for a public school, provided the school district concurs. It was moved and seconded to amend this motion by substituting the words, "that the town purchase the existing town hall building from the United States of America and secure its removal to a new location." On the motion to

amend, the vote by ballot was as follows: Yes, 18; no, 55; and the amendment was rejected. The main question being, "Shall the town build a new town hall building, said building to include facilities for a public school, provided the school district concurs?", the vote by ballot was as follows: Yes, 46; no, 33. And the moderator declared the motion adopted.

It was voted to accept the offer of Ella Tarr of Contoocook to install a water system in the Riverdale Cemetery as a gift to the town.

It was voted to accept the offer of Jennie Tewksbury of Warner to give the sum of \$200 to the town in trust to use the income thereof for the care and maintenance of the Jesse Jackman lot in the Riverdale Cemetery.

It was voted to adjourn this meeting to the 12th day of April next at ten o'clock in the forencen at the Grange Hall in Webster.

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Webster, in the County of Merrimack and said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Grange hall in said Webster on the twelfth day of April, 1941, next, at two of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To discontinue the public cemetery lying between the town hall and the Blackwater River, to authorize the removal of the remains of persons buried therein, to authorize and empower the Board of Selectmen to sell and convey to the United States of America, by good and sufficient deed, full title to the land comprising said cemetery, to authorize and empower the Board of Selectmen to supervise the improvement of the cemetery lot on Corser Hill and, in particular, but without limiting the generality of the foregoing, to act upon resolutions as follows:

Whereas under authority of the Act of Congress approved June 22, 1936 (49 Stat. 1570) entitled "An Act authorizing the construction of certain public works on rivers and harbors for flood control and other purposes" as amended by Act of Congress approved June 28, 1938 (52 Stat. 1215) bearing the same title as that of the first mentioned act, and as further authorized by Chapter 149 of the Laws of 1939 of The State of New Hampshire entitled "An Act consenting to the acquisition of lands

by the United States for flood control and navigation purposes", the United States of America is constructing a dam known as the Blackwater River Flood Control Dam across the Blackwater River at a point in said Town of Webster known as Swett's Mills, thus creating above said dam a reservoir or basin within which to store the flood waters of said river for the alleviation of flood damages at down stream points; and

Whereas the public cemetery lying between the town hall and the Blackwater River will be so injuriously affected by flooding as to necessitate its discontinuance and removal from its present location to a new site; and

Whereas in the above mentioned act of June 28, 1938, the Secretary of War is authorized and directed to acquire in the name of the United States title to all such lands or rights therein as are required in the prosecution of said flood control project;

- I. Now, Therefore, be it resolved that the public cemetery lying between the town hall and the Blackwater River be discontinued, said discontinuance to take effect upon the delivery of a deed of the land comprising said cemetery by the Town of Webster to the United States of America.
- II. Be it further resolved that the Board of Selectmen of the Town of Webster be and they hereby are authorized to sell and convey to the United States of America, by good and sufficient deed, full title to the land comprising said cemetery for and in consideration of the accomplishment of the following work and acts, said deed to be delivered to the United States of America upon the accomplishment of said work and acts as follows:
- (a) The cemetery situated between the town hall and the Blackwater River shall be transferred by and at the expense of the United States to the unoccupied cemetery lot situated on Corser Hill, which new site is shown on the map marked "Merrimack Valley Flood Control. Blackwater Reservoir. Location of Old and New Cemeteries."

- (b) The transfer of said cemetery to the new site shall be accomplished to the extent and in the manner set forth in the specifications entitled "Specifications for Relocation of Old Meeting House Cemetery, Webster, New Hampshire."
- (c) In addition to the appurtenances provided for in said specifications, a well shall be driven by and at the expense of the United States on the Corser Hill Cemetery lot, said well to be fitted with a two-inch galvanized pipe and a Myers double acting, self-priming hand pump set on a concrete curb four feet square and six inches in thickness at the base of the pump, the top of the curb to be flush with the ground. The location of the well and the quantity of the water it is capable of supplying shall be subject to the approval of the Board of Selectmen.
- (d) In the event that the selectmen receive requests that re-interment of certain remains be made in some public cemetery within the town other than the one designated herein as the Corser Hill Cemetery, which choice for re-interment is accorded the nearest surviving relatives by Section 9, Chapter 55, Public Laws of New Hampshire, all such requests shall be transmitted to the District Engineer, United States Engineer Office, Park Square Building, Boston, Massachusetts not later than April 26, 1941, so that appropriate provisions for carrying out the requests may be included in the specifications referred to above in paragraph II(b).
- (d) Upon the completion of the transfer of said cemetery to the new site, the Town of Webster shall be furnished by and at the expense of the United States with a card index and plan showing the number of each grave, the name of the person buried in each grave if known, the exact location of each remains within the limits of each burial lot or grave, and the date of re-interment.

The plan and specifications referred to in paragraphs II(a) and II(b) are on file in the office of the Town Clerk and at the store of Arthur C. Stebbins, being two of the most public places in said town, and may be inspected there by all interested parties.

- 2. To take any action incidental to or in furtherance of the proposals contained in article 1.
- 3. To authorize and empower the Board of Selectmen to build a town shed on the town land on Pleasant Street, using town labor.

# Record of Special Meeting of Town of Webster, April 12, 1941

A special meeting of the inhabitants of the Town of Webster, qualified to vote in town affairs, was held at the Grange Hall in said Webster on the twelfth day of April, 1941 at two of the clock in the afternoon.

Howard E. Darling, Chairman of the Board of Selectmen, called the meeting to order at 2: P.M.. Because of the inability to serve of the moderator, the supervisors of the check list appointed George Everett Scribner as temporary Moderator, and in open meeting he took the oath of office by law prescribed and assumed the chair. The warrant was read by the temporary Moderator.

Mr. Sawyer offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

"Whereas under authority of the Act of Congress approved June 22, 1936 (49 Stat. 1570) entitled 'An Act authorizing the construction of certain public works on rivers and harbors for flood control and other purposes' as amended by Act of Congress approved June 28, 1938 (52 Stat. 1215) bearing the same title as that of the first mentioned act, and as further authorized by Chapter 149 of the Laws of 1939 of The State of New Hampshire entitled 'An Act consenting to the acquisition of lands by the United States for flood control and navigation purposes', the United States of America is constructing a dam known as the Blackwater River Flood Control Dam across the Blackwater River at a point in said Town of Webster known as Swett's Mills, thus creating above said dam a reservoir or basin within which to store the flood waters of said river for the alleviation of flood damages at down stream points; and

"Whereas the public cemetery lying between the town hall and the Blackwater River will be so injuriously affected by flooding as to necessitate its discontinuance and removal from its present location to a new site; and

"Whereas in the above mentioned act of June 28, 1938, the Secretary of War is authorized and directed to acquire in the name of the United States title to all such lands or rights therein as are required in the prosecution of said flood control project;

"Now, Therefore, be it resolved that the public cemetery lying between the town hall and the Blackwater River be discontinued, said discontinuance to take effect upon the delivery of a deed of the land comprising said cemetery by the Town of Webster to the United States of America."

This motion was seconded by Mr. Mock and the meeting proceeded to ballot using the check list. The total number of ballots given in was 73, of which there were: Yes, 72; No, 1, and the temporary Moderator declared the resolution adopted.

Mr. Sawyer offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

"Be it further resolved that the Board of Selectmen of the Town of Webster be and they hereby are authorized to sell and convey to the United States of America, by good and sufficient deed, full title to the land comprising said cemetery for and in consideration of the accomplishment of the following work and acts, said deed to be delivered to the United States of America upon the accomplishment of said work and acts as follows:

- "(a) The cemetery situated between the town hall and the Blackwater River shall be transferred by and at the expense of the United States to the unoccupied cemetery lot situated on Corser Hill, which new site is shown on the map marked 'Merrimack Valley Flood Control. Blackwater Reservoir. Location of Old and New Cemeteries.'
- "(b) The transfer of said cemetery to the new site shall be accomplished to the extent and in the manner set forth in the specifications entitled 'Specifications for Relocation of Old Meeting House Cemetery, Webster, New Hampshire.'
- "(c) In addition to the appurtenances provided for in said specifications, a well shall be driven by and at the expense of the United States on the Corser Hill Cemetery lot, said well to be fitted with a two-inch galvanized pipe and a Myers double acting, self-priming hand pump set on a concrete curb four feet square and six innhes in thickness at the base of the pump, the top of the curb to be flush with the ground. The location of the well and the quantity of the water it is capable of supplying shall be subject to the approval of the Board of Selectmen.
- "(d) In the event that the selectmen receive requests that re-interment of certain remains be made in some public cemetery within the town other than the one designated herein as the Corser Hill Cemetery, which choice for re-interment is accorded the nearest surviving relatives by Section 9, Chapter 55, Public Laws of New Hampshire, all such requests shall be transmitted to the District Engineer, United States Engineer Office, Park Square Building, Boston, Massachusetts not later than April 26, 1941, so that appropriate provisions for carrying out the requests may be included in the specifications referred to above in paragraph (b).
- "(e) Upon the completion of the transfer of said cemetery to the new site, the Town of Webster shall be furnished by and at the expense of the United States with a card index and plan showing the number of each grave, the name of the person buried in each grave if known, the exact location of each remains within the limits of each burial lot or grave, and the date of re-interment."

This motion was seconded by Mr. Mock. The meeting proceeded to ballot on the resolution using the check list. The total number of ballots given in was 63, of which there were: Yes, 63; No, O, and the temporary Moderator declared the resolution adopted.

It was voted to authorize and empower the Board of Selectmen to acquire all necessary land for a town shed at some suitable location and to build a town shed at such location using town labor.

It was voted to adjourn the meeting without day.

total number of ballots given in was 84, of which there were: Yes, 59;
No, 25, and the Moderator declared article 14 laid on the table.

It was voted to lay article 15 on the table.

It was moved and seconded that article 18 be laid on the table for one year. The total number of ballots given in was

85, of which there were: Yes, 62; No, 23, and the Moderator declared article 18 laid on the table for one year.

It was voted to lay articles 19, 20 and 21 on the table indefinitely.

It was voted to adjourn the meeting without day.

The Annual Town Meeting of the Town of Webster was called to order in the Old Town House by the Moderator, Arthur C. Stebbins, at 10:30 a.m. Prayer was offered by Rev. Hermon L. Sawyer.

After the reading of the Warrant, the business of choosing all necessary town officials was taken up as in Article 1.

It was voted to have the Clerk cast one ballot for Adam E. Mock to serve as Clerk for the ensuing year, and Mr. Mock was duly elected.

For Treasurer - the Clerk was instructed to cast one ballot for Edwin C. Gerrish and Mr. Gerrish was so elected.

For Selectman for three years, there were two candidates: Leslie E. Frost and Herman V. Wibel. Mr. Wibel received 21 votes and Mr. Frost 88. Leslie E. Frost was declared elected Selectman for three (3) years.

For Road Agent in District #1, there were two candidates: Nathan A. Mock and Sherman P. Stevens. Mr. Stevens reveived 45 votes and Mr. Mock 57 votes. Nathan A. Mock was elected Road Agent in District #1 for the ensuing year.

For Road Agent in District #2, the Clerk was instructed to cast one ballot for Daniel L. Holmes for the ensuing year and Mr. Holmes was so elected.

For Road Agent in District #3 there were three candidates: John H. Allen, Kenneth F. Hoar and Herman V. Wibel.
Mr. Wibel received 1 vote; Mr. Allen received 40 votes and
Mr. Hoar 74 votes. Kenneth F. Hoar was elected Road Agent in
District #3 for the ensuing year.

For Tax Collector, the Clerk was instructed to cast one ballot for George E. Scribner and Mr. Scribner was elected for the ensuing year.

For Trustee of the Trust Funds, the Clerk was instructed to cast one ballot for Stuart Fifield and Mr. Fifield was elected for three years.

For Library Trustees, the Clerk was instructed to cast one ballot for Hermon L. Sawyer for Library Trustee for one year and he was so elected.

The Clerk was then instructed to cast one ballot for Stuart Fifield for Library Trustee for three years and Stuart Fifield was declared elected Library Trustee for three years.

(It was necessary to elect two trustees of the Library because of the resignation of two members)

For Auditors, the Clerk was instructed to cast one ballot for Walter G. Goodhue who was elected and one ballot for Wm. E. Phelps who was also elected both these gentlemen to serve for the ensuing year.

Under Article 2
The town voted to raise and appropriate \$3000 to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

Under Article 3

a. The town voted to raise and appropriate one-half of one per cent of the total valuation for town maintenance.

b. The town voted to raise and appropriate #100 for oiling roads.

c. The town voted to raise and appropriate \$2500 for plowing and sanding roads.

d. The town voted to raise and appropriate \$400 for

general expense of the Highway Department.

(It was explained that this will include repairs to machinery, and new culverts where needed. It was suggested that the contractor at the Blackwater Dam whose heavy machinery broke culverts on the Little Hill Road, be asked to pay for same.)

Under Article 4

The town voted to raise and appropriate \$418.22
for Class V Road Construction.

Under Article 5

- a. The town voted to raise and appropriate \$600 for town poor.
- b. The town voted to raise and appropriate \$400 for old age assistance.

Under Article 6

The town voted to raise and appropriate \$100 for the Town Library.

Under Article 7

a. The town voted to raise and appropriate \$85 for Old Home Day.

b. The town voted to raise and appropriate \$35 for Memorial Day.

Under Article 8
The town voted not to raise \$400 for control of pine blister rust and also voted to pass this article over.

Under Article 9

The town voted to raise 1/100 of one per cent of the total valuation of the town which would be \$53, for the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee project which advertises the attractions and resources of the town.

Under Article 10

Mr. Bert Tilton explained that the money obtainable from the Trust Funds might all be needed for the new cemetery and that as the fences at the Riverdale and Beaver Dam Cemeteries need painting, the town should raise money for this purpose. It was voted to lay this article upon the table to be taken up at the adjourned meeting.

Under Article 11

It was voted to discontinue that portion of a certain town highway between a point easterly of the Glendon on the Warner-Webster town line and the site of the old Amesbury bridge over the Warner river, subject to gates and bars.

Article 12

It was unanimously voted to lay this article on the table.

Under Article 13

It was voted to allow the Selectmen to borrow \$8000 in anticipation of taxes.

Under Article 14 & Article 15

It was voted to lay both these articles on the table for the present.

Under Article 16

In discussing this article, the Selectmen advised that the report had reached them that the government had offered \$10,000 for the Old Town House, but this had not been verified by Washington. It was voted to lay this article on the table temporarily and was then voted to take up Article 24.

Article 24

It was voted to leave the sale of the Town House to the Selectmen according to article 24. Some argument was introduced as to the price the Selectmen should accept. Mr. E. C. Gerrish wishes to leave it to the Selectment to do the right thing. Mr. Hermon Sawyer suggested a resolution that the Selectmen be advised to accept at least \$10,000. Previously the Selectmen said they had asked the Government for \$12,000 but never received an answer except the notice that the building was to be condemned

Mr. Shugrue then asked if the Government would build a building for us. Lawyer Upton replied that the Government would
build no buildings. Mr. Hermon Sawyer then offered the
resolution that we express the sentiment of the town by
authorizing the Selectmentto accept \$10,000 if they can get
it rather than let the Condemnation Proceedings be carried out.

#### Mnder Article 16

The question embodied in this article, it was explained, is whether the town is going to use this old building or have a new one. If the town votes to keep this building, the article for the new building can and will be passed over.

Mr. Hermon Sawyer said he had lived in two different towns without town halls, and as this town is at present so upset, he suggested and made the motion that we lay this article on the table. His motion was not in order and so did not go to a vote. Mr. Upton made the point that the Government would dispose of this building before we could decide later what action to take. It was then voted to lay Article 16 on the table temporarily and take up Article 14.

#### Under Article 14

The Selectmen explained that they had the Planning Board come up to look over the town for the possible sites desirable for a town hall. They recommended Corser Hill as a fine site for a Civic Center. Mr. Mock agreed that Corser Hill is a nice site, but he suggested that we consider the conditions resulting from a public hall. Corser Hill is a residential district and he questioned whether or not we want our hall there.

Mr. Phelps said that he had argued for a Town House on Corser Hill and still wanted it there. "There is no condition yet made," he said. "that the Town must let the Town Hall for Public Dances."

Mr. Wibel suggested that if the Town House is at Corser Hill the library will be a long way from the South part of the town.

The motion was made to have those who want the town house located on Corser Hill vote "Corser Hill" and those who want it at Sweatt's Mills vote "Sweatt's Mills".

Mr. Shugrue made the motion that this matter of choosing the site for the Town Hall be laid on the table until the roads are built. This motion took precedence over the other but it was voted not to lay the matter of a Town Hall site on the table.

The result of the first ballot on the choice of location for a Town Hall was 52 for Sweatt's Mills and 52 for Corser Hill.

The second ballot gave the result of Sweatt's Mills 52 and Corser Hill 54, thus making the Corser Hill Site the one chosen.

Mr. Frost then moved that the new Town Hall be located on the land of Eva Hall on Corser Hill. This motion was not carried.

Robert Pearson moved to adjourn the meeting, but this motion was not seconded.

The motion was then made to allow the Selectmen to buy land Bor the new Town Hall Site as they deemed it expedient. This was promptly seconded and the vote resulted in YES 57 NO 19. This motion was carried.

Under Article 18

The motion was made that the town build a new Town Hall and that the new building include room for school rooms. It was also suggested that we buy the old one and move it.

Mr. G. E. Scribner said that he would like to see a new town hall; he felt that we could not afford to move the old one. It would not be wise to maintain the old one as it is out of date, with no modern conveniences. If we start to modernize it, he felt it would cost too much. He would like to have a new Town Hall, with Library, Auditorium, Selectmen's rooms, etc. "We should give serious consideration to the matter before voting," he said, for we shall have to buy the old one, modernize it and move it. We have now no place for public entertainment. We have not a floor in town suitable for dancing."

Mr. Hermon Sawyer then said that he was born and brought up in Webster and his earliest recollections were many of them connected with the Old Town House. "I ought to have sentiment about this town hall if anyone has," he said, "but I do not think the boys and girls of the coming day will have those memories and this old building will not be as useful as a new building. It is a question of whether you want this for memories or a new one for the generations to come. For myself, I would feel sorry to see this taken down, sorry to see it go, but if I had children or grandchildren who would live here in the future, I should be in favor of something more suitable."

The motion to buy and move the Old Toan House was put to a vote with the result YES (to buy it) 18 and NO(not to buy it)55

The motion was made and this time seconded to build a new Town Hall. Mr. Hermon Sawyer made the motion to lay this motion on the table with a resulting vote in the negative.

Under Article 18 it was voted to build a new Town Hall, the vote being NO-33 and YES-46

A communication from Mrs. Ella Tarr had been received saying that she wishes to put some water system in the Riverdale Cemetery for the use of the town. She will put it in as a gift to the town and wanted some action taken upon it. It was voted to accept her offer.

Mrs. Jennie Tewksbury, of Warner, wishes to give \$200 for the care of the Jessie Jackman lot in the Riverdale Cemetery and the town voted to accept this gift.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:20 p m until April 12, 1941 at the Grange Hall, Webster, at 10:00 a m.

To the best of my knowledge and ability, this is a correct but not verbatim report of the Annual Meeting of the Town of Webster, March 11, 1941.

Unanimous vote 220

Article 11. Discussion about the skating rink. (\$300 was requested for the maintenance of the playground and skating area). Voted down the article as read but \$300 was voted for Park and Playground.

Article. 12. Voted to purchase a new fire truck for \$24,000, with \$20,000 to be used from Revenue Sharing Funds and a sum not to exceed \$4000 to be raised by taxes in 1973; Yes 122 No 25 This vote followed a lengthy discussion about the expenditure of the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund; William Phelps registered a protest to the Selectmen Concerning #the procedure used in presenting the use of the Revenue Sharing Funds to the voters at this meeting, on the grounds they have been denied their right of a choice as to what this money should be spent for."

Article 13. Following a report by Mrs. Geraldine Fereshetian, in behalf of the Pillsbury Leke Action Committee, the article to see if the town will vote to petition the N. H. State Tax Commission to re-value all taxable property of the Town, was voted to be tabled.

Article 14. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a committee to recommend a sanitary landfill site and appropriate the sum of \$500 for

expenses.

Article 15. Voted to designate Bashan and Gerrish Roads from Dingit Co Corner to Deer Meadow Road and Blackwater Road as scenic, under the provisions of RSA 253:17 & 18, for the purposes of protecting and enhancing the scenic beauty of the Town of Webster.

Article 16. There was a discussion and vote relative to raising \$500 to aid in the support of the local kindergarten. This was defeated by a vote of 80 to 29.

Article 17. It was voted to change the name of the Webster Community Park to the William R. Pearson Memorial Park, in honor of "Bill"Pearson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Pearson, Jr. of Webster.

Article 18. Voted to authorize the establishment of a five member Parks and Recreation Commission whose members are to be appointed by the Selectmen for three years. First appointments to be less than 3 years to establish sequence of appointments.

Article 19. Voted to establish the term of road agent for a period of three years. First vote would be Town Meeting 1974.

Article 20. Voted to have the town authorize a Town Tax Map Committee

and appropriate \$500 for expenses. art 21 - To see of the low will establish a Conserv. Com m. as set forth in Article 21. A standing vote of thanks was given to Jeremy Pendleton

Robillard; Road Agent, 1 year, Robert H. Roby; Auditors, Eleanor M. Richardson and Mabel M. Anderson, 1 year; Trustee of Trust Funds, 3 years, Lloyd H. Stone, Sr.; Library Trustee, 2 years, Carol Creighton; Civil Defense Director, 1 year, Emerson G. Hoar.\* \*(should have been appointed)

Article 2. \$9050 voted for Town charges: Town officers salaries, \$4500; Town officers expenses, \$700, Election & Registration \$350, General Expense (Town reports), \$1000, Expense of Town Hall & other town buildings, \$400; Police Dept., \$500; Insurance, \$1000; Damage and legal expenses, \$500; Civil Defense, \$100...total \$9050.

Article 3. Voted \$4000 for Summer maintenance of highways and bridges and \$6000 for Winter maintenance; \$3500 for Mar roads, \$1000 for General expense of Highway Dept. and \$200 for Street Lighting.

Article 4. Sum of \$647.26 for Class V road construction voted.

Article 5. Public Welfare. \$500 voted for Town Poor and Old Age Assistance.

Article 6. \$400 voted for Town Library.

Article 7. \$300 voted for Old Home Day. Voted to pass over \$75 in the budget, for Memorial Day, having approximately that amount in the bank.

Article 8. Support of Hy-Mar Fire Dept., including forest fires. \$1800 voted.

Article 9. \$1500 voted for cemeteries.

Article 10. \$91.20 voted for eradication of White Pine Blister Rust.

Article 11. \$29 voted toward operating deficit of Concord Hospital.

Article 12. Vote of 127-0, to authorize and empower the Board of Selectmen to borrow for the town, by issuance of notes, a sum not exceeding \$50, 000, in anticipation of taxes.

Article 13. Voted \$300 for maintenance of playground.

Article 14. Voted \$25 for opening old roads and trails for forest fire protection.

Article 15. Voted 51..No, 49...Yes, against carrying out purchase of Grange Hall, upon satisfactory survey of lot, with Selectmen and Town counsel to be reasonably satisfied with sellers' title.

Article 16. \$1000 voted for rent of Grange Hall for year 1968 and Town Meeting, 1969.

Article 17. Voted that the town continue the practice of snow plowing private driveways, provided that such service be performed at times and always subordinate and incidental to the regular winter maintenance of the public highways and that the Board of Selectmen be authorized to institute a scale of rates for such service based upon the cost of service as determined by them and the Road Agent be authorized to give priority to occupations directly concerned with the public health and safety.

Article 18. Voted not to adopt the Australian type of ballot voting.

Resolution presented by Maurice Chapin, as follows:

Resolved, that the legal voters present and voting at the 1968
Webster Town Meeting go on record as favoring that the Board of Selectmen shall raise the 1968 valuation of Public Utility Companies in the Town of Webster to a 100 % valuation, this figure to be arrived at by using the 1966 tax records as 40% of full and true valuation. Voted 49. Yes 3. No in favor of accepting these resolutions. Recommendation made by Joshua Taylor that in the future legal counsel be present at future town meetings. Meeting adjourned. #### Town Meeting

#### Grange Hall Webster

March 11, 1969

Meeting called to order at 9:05 by Moderator Pro-tempore, Randolph Inman; invocation given by Rev. C. Elsie Dame.

Motion made and seconded to authorize this town meeting as a duly constituted meeting; so voted.

Motion made and seconded to dispense with reading the warrant, which was voted.

Town officers elected as follows, with one ballot: Ruth Stebbins, Town Clerk, William Phelps, Treasurer, Helen Scribner, Tax Collector (all for one year) Robert Robillard, Selectman for three years.

Nominations for Robert Hoar and Paul Jones for Road Agent were made. Ballot vote...total votes cast 99; Paul Jones was elected with 62; 37 votes for Robert Hoar.

Eleanor Richardson and Mabel Anderson were elected Auditors for the ensuing year, by one ballot. Cynthia Anderson was elected to serve the unexpired term of the late Mack Thornton, as Trustee of Trust Funds and Lloyd H. Stone, Sr. was re-elected as Trustee for a three year term, both by one ballot, each.

Miriam Lorden was re-elected Library Trustee for three years, by one ballot. Vote passed to have the Selectmen appoint the remaining town officers.

Article 2. Town Charges. Voted that we pass to Article 20, in regard to establishing salaries of Selectmen (annual amount...fixed sum of \$600, with an additional amount of \$150 for the Chairman). Passed over Article 20..voice vote.

Paul Mock announced a printing error in the omission of \$800 for Town Dump and Garbage Removal in the budget.

Voted, the sum of \$12,600 be raised under Article 2. to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

Article 3. Summer Maintenance. Need for maintenance of the dirt roads at Pillsbury Lake. When a survey is made in 1970 of unpaved streets at Pillsbury Lake, we will then be entitled to more Duncan Fund money. Joseph Degen requested clarification of roads being taken over by the town. Mr. Robillard stated that if there are no regulations or planning, the town must take over the roads. Newport Circle has not been accepted, as it is covered by water in the spring-time and there are no houses at present there. Voted: \$4500 for Summer Maintenance, \$9000 for Winter Maintenance and \$3500 for maintenance of present tar roads. \$1000 voted for General Expense Highway Dept. \$200 voted for Street Lighting.

Article 4. Class V money was spent on Davisville section of Webster in 1968; section of Deer Meadow Road near Concord line. Paul Mock spoke of the excellent manner that funds were handled by our Town Road Agent during the 25 years he served and suggested that a standing ovation be given Robert Roby later in the meeting. Suggestion made that money be spent on Roby Road and the need on Pearson Hill was also mentioned. Voted to leave spending of this money to the Selectmen. The State's approval is needed in this matter. \$643.34 voted to be raised.

Article 5. \$500 (total) voted for Town Poor and Old Age Assistance.

Article 6. Voted \$500 for Town Library. The Robillards had given \$100 (through the Fire Dept.) after their fire.

Artisle 7. \$375 voted for Memorial Day and Old Home Day.

Article 8. \$1800 voted for Fire Dept. and forest fires. Chief Kenneth F. announced that \$100 donation had been made by the Burns family following their fire.

#### Town Meeting 1969

Article 9. Discussion of Cemetery Trust Funds...interest used to maintain lots and for perpetual care. \$1500 voted for care of cemeteries.

Article 10. \$80 voted for eradication of White Pine Blister Rust.

Article 11. \$45 voted toward operating deficit of Concord Hospital.

Article 12. Voted to authorize and empower the Board of Selectmen to borrow a sum not exceeding \$50,000 (as specified in the warrant under this article) Standing vote 117 Yes (unanimous)

Article 13. \$300 voted for Playground maintenance.

Article 14. \$25 voted for opening old roads and old trails.

Article 15. Rent of Grange Hall. As \$1000 was included for rent of the hall in the \$1200 raised under Article 2.(expense Town Hall and other Town buildings) it was voted to pass over Article 15.

Article 16. Relative to establishing a Planning Board. Voted to have the Moderator Pro-tem read the brochure concerning Planning Boards. Then it was later voted, that by ballot we pass over Articles 16,17,18 and 19.

Total votes 109 72 Yes 36 No 1 disallowed

Voted to recess one hour for lunch.

The meeting reconvened at 1:00 P. M.

Article 21. Voted that we do not adopt By-laws regulating trailers (by ballot vote) Total votes 102 80 Yes 22 No

Article 22. Resolutions read by Jeremy Pendleton, in appreciation to Robert Roby for his many years of faithful service as Town Road Agent and a standing ovation was given.

Question, in regard to increased rates for Public Utilities. The Tax Commission has not yet come up with an approved rate for Utilities.

Resolutions read by Marion Davis: that the Selectmen be directed to arrange for the election by ballot of all elected town officers and to keep the polls open from 9:00 A. M. to noon and from 5:00 P. M. to 8: 00 P.M. on the day of the annual Town Meeting. Voted accepted as read.

Resolutions read by Joseph Degen: that the Selectmen be directed to arrange establish rules governing and arrange for the filing of candidacies for all elected town officers at least 10 days prior to the date of the annual Town Meeting, with no filing fee to be charged. Voice vote No (majority)

Resolutions read by Minous Cannon: that the Town Report include in it a report of the actions of the previous Town Meeting. Voted accepted as read.

Voted that the Resolutions read by Marion Davis (regarding election by ballot of elected town officers, etc.) be put in the warrant as an article for next Town Meeting.

Kenneth R. Hoar suggested that appreciation be expressed to Randolph Inman for serving as Moderator today. (applause)

Voted to adjourn the meeting.

#### LAWS OF THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

Passed January Session, 1937

Chapter 175

AN ACT RELATING TO EXEMPTIONS FROM TAXATION

Section

Section

1. Application of provisions

2. Takes effect.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- l. Application of Provisions. Amend section 25-a of chapter 60 of the Public Laws, as inserted by chapter 148 of the laws of 1931, by striking out said section and inserting in place thereof the following: 25-a: Improvements Only Exempted; Limitations. The exemptions referred to in sections 22, 24 and 25 of this chapter, as regards real estate hereafter acquired by such institutions, shall apply only to subsequent improvements therein and thereon, and the real estate so acquired shall be assessed and taxed as other similar land and real estate in the vicinity is assessed and taxed. This section shall not apply to real estate owned by religious societies incorporated or organized within this state and occupied by their pastors or clergy in active service or to real estate owned and occupied by the Grand Army of the Republic, the United Spanish War Veterans, Veterans of Foreign Wars, the American Legion, or to real estate acquired and used in substitution for property in this state theretofore exempt from taxation.
  - 2. Takes Effect. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
